Drs. Al-Zahrani and Bakheit¹ noted that systematic gait analysis is a recent development. However, there has been at least one distinguished predecessor. Ibn Ridwan (998-1069)^{2,3} advocated a thorough history and examination including evaluating muscle strength by lifting weights and grasping objects, and by observing the patient's gait both forwards and backwards.³
